## Who is God...?

Elohim, (God the Mighty Creator), Jehovah Rohi (The Lord My Shepard), Jehovah Tsurì- (The Lord My Rock), Jehovah Jireh (The Lord My Provider), Jehovah Rophe (My God the Healer) and some more impactful names that you can read in the Bible App of your phone. One in particular that I used is named “Praying and Praising God’s Names.” This might be helpful to you; however, to your child(ren) not so much. With kids we have to start from the beginning; therefore, starting with **Genesis 1-2:1-4** is a great start! Make it fun by recalling what God made on each day with your readers. My kids enjoyed movements to help them recall. For example, like flicking the light switch for day 1. You can be creative with this one! All you are establishing is that God is the Mighty Creator.

You can then hop over to **Psalm 103** and read to your children what David reminds us God does. Both are great talking points to get your readers minds going and get some great questions. You might not be able to answer everything at that moment, so do not get flustered. Instead use those unanswered questions as an influence for you to study more apart and together.

As you study more and more, you will see that God is everywhere (omnipresent), all knowing (omniscience) and all powerful (omnipotence). Finally, you bring it all together and explain how God is inside of each one of us. I love **Ephesians 3** prayer, specifically verses **16-17** “I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith...” When you believe (faith) in God, his all-sufficient supply will dwell inside you. “God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all you need, you will have in large numbers in every good work.” 2 Corinthians 9:8. God is your source, we are anointed and equipped for our seasons.

### **Three Men in the Furnace**

In **Daniel 3**, my oldest shared that he admired the men’s courage to stand firm in their belief. They would not bend in their values. They were secure in whatever plan God had for them. This story actually helped us to discuss death and how it’s important to put our faith in God no matter the outcome.
